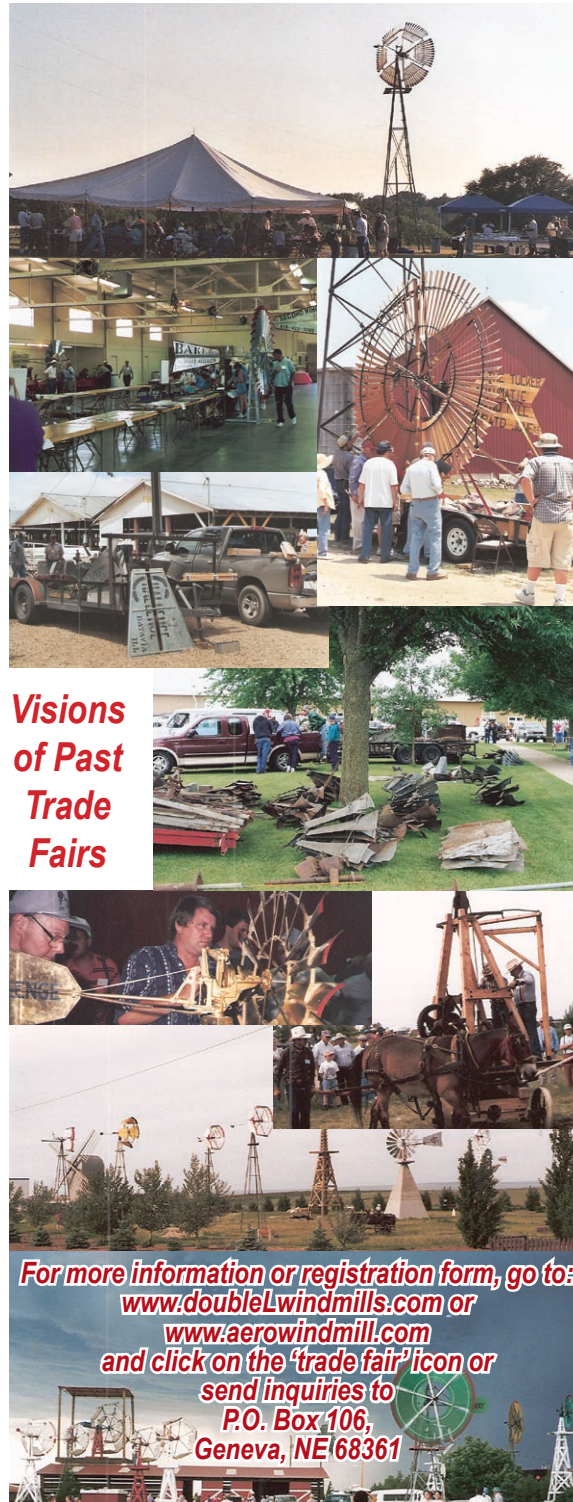

Solomon D. Butcher

This Nebraska photographer produced, between 1886 and 1912, a collection of more than 3,000 photographs recording the settlement of the Great Plains. Born in what is now West Virginia, Butcher came with his family to the plains of Nebraska in 1880 to homestead. He soon found that he was not up to the rigors of a homesteader's life, however he had developed a profound admiration for those with the grit to survive on the Nebraska prairies. Realizing that the period of settlement would soon be over, he set out to create a photographic history of pioneer life. Solomon D. Butcher's work has survived to become the most important chronicle of the saga of homesteading in America.

Story of the Pipe Organ

This organ was built in the early 1930s at Hyacinthe, Canada. It was originally installed in a hospital chapel in St. Jeans, Canada, south of Montreal, and was played by Sister Marie Desire until it was removed in 1985. Roger Bailey purchased it in 1992 and it was hauled to its current home on a car trailer. An 8 ft. principle was added in 1996 and five more ranks of pipes were added this past year. The organ operates on 3/4 inches of air pressure. It has 859 sounding pipes, the largest being 102" tall and the smallest is about the size of a pencil; and consists of 15 ranks of pipes with 11 couplers.
